

#### **Summary of District Reports**

The District reports at the Convention were too lengthy to place in this publication. The editor chose those details which might give other clubs ideas of programs or projects.

#### District I

Redstone Garden Club collects glass jars and bottles, corks for crafts, calendars, cards, notepads for elderly homes, and mascara wands for wildlife recue Used to smooth feathers/fur and remove parasites.

Blossomwood Garden Club does monthly to the Manna House Hydroponic Garden to harvest lettuce to feed needy families.

#### **District II**

Cherokee Rose Club maintains a bird sanctuary outside the county library. They hosted two flower shows for the District.

Colony Garden Club hosted an Open House for their 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

Rhododendron Garden Club published a pamphlet identifying wildflowers that should not be destroyed while clearing properties.

#### District III

District III received three Deep South Awards this year.

Edgewood Garden Club celebrates 93 years as a garden club. They are helping the city of Homewood identify and tag trees for educational value.

#### **District IV**

In recognition of Arbor Day the Goldenrod Club planted 20 oak trees and 10 other trees, Greensboro club planted 5 trees and have 4 maple trees to be planted, the Fayette Club planted a variety of 20 trees and Tuscaloosa/Northport Club planted 5 apple trees and also donated \$68 to "Pennies for Pines".

Our clubs are actively involved in our schools by either reading books like "The Saved Seed" to elementary children or teaching about Pollinators or container gardening. Ceres and Tuscaloosa/Northport clubs work together on several educational projects many of which are funded by grants. Container gardening projects are also used to involve our senior citizens living in senior housing facilities. The Fayette Club was instrumental in Bevill State Community College starting a garden club for their students.

#### **District V**

We dowee Garden club celebrated its 75th anniversary this year. One of their programs was by a landscapers who received a scholarship from the club.

 Now your Roster is "Live" again. When you go through this process you no longer have to retype all of your member's information. It's 'renewed' in front of you. Big time saver for all of us!
